## Day 1

Arrival at Nice Airport

Welcome by France Golf Tours - Travel to your hotel (45mn)

Golf at **Terre Blanche golf course**, two championship courses winding through pine and oak-clad hills and valleys, providing golfers with sweeping views of neighbouring villages and the Southern Alps. Dave Thomas, the architect, has designed what is now considered as 2 of the best courses on the French Riviera.



**Le Château course** is a long course featuring several water hazards which test the ability of the more advanced golfer.



### Day 2

## Golf at Sainte Maxime golf course

Designed by English architect Don Harradine, Sainte Maxime International golf club offers some of the best views of the spectacular bay of Saint-Tropez, as you make your way through the wild heather of Provence with its charming scent

Surrounded by sparkling sea, wild heather and forests of cork-oaks, Sainte Maxime's 18 holes are generously spread over 150 acres of hilly land, offering superb views

**Saint-Tropez**, a wonderful seaside village with legendary reputation for both quality of life and its architecture including the fortified citadel. Home of the famous French movie star Brigitte Bardot, the international renown of Saint-Tropez attracts many celebrities on their luxury yachts every summer.

Though the peninsula of St-Tropez is one of the most frequented touristic sites in the world, the small village of **Gassin** which overlooks this remains little known today. However, like a jewel poised on its green mat, Gassin offers to visitors magic moments of mystery.

One is amazed, with the impression of being on the roof of the world! As far as the eye can see, the deep blue sea contrasts with the tender green of forest and vineyards shared by no less than seven wine domains and "chateaux".



After contemplating this unique panorama, one strolls gently through pretty, winding streets adorned with flowers. Now one understands why Gassin acquired the distinction of "Plus Beau Village de France"!

**Ramatuelle** is another typical village of Provence situated in the peninsula of Saint-Tropez.

Perched on the top of a hill of ancient cork-oaks and pines, Ramatuelle is surrounded by vineyards giving some famous wine. Traditional craftsmen, tiny local stores and Provencal restaurants along pedestrian streets make Ramatuelle one of the most popular village in Provence French Riviera.

## Day 3

Golf at Terre Blanche golf course, two championship courses winding through pine and oak-clad hills and valleys, providing golfers with sweeping views of neighbouring villages and the Southern Alps. Le Riou course is more technical, with its narrow and hilly fairways surrounded by many bunkers and dog legs almost on all par 4 and par 5.

## Day 4

## **Guided Tour in Provence French Riviera**


#### **Nice**

Its worth taking the time to discover Nice in depth: wander at random through the narrow streets of the old town and then stroll along the famous "Promenade" before entering into the heart of the city with its rich architectural and cultural heritage and its parks and gardens. Nice has a total of 19 museums and galleries, 32 classified historical monuments and 300 ha of parks and gardens, woodland and green areas in addition to 150 ornamental lakes and fountains.



#### Nice Old town

With its narrow, shadowy streets, cozy squares, colourful markets, baroque churches and jumble of pastel houses, Vieux Nice looks and feels much as it must have about two centuries ago. The sounds are different though, at least at night when music from the bars and nightclubs fills the air with rhythm. The bustle of tourists and shoppers is replaced by teams of young clubbers prowling the streets for the latest hangout. Especially on summer evenings, the Old Town resembles a vast open-air party.



But during the day, Vieux Nice harbors some remarkable buildings that recall Nice's eventful history.

Today's Opera House (Rue Saint-François de Paule) was built on the site of the former municipal theatre, destroyed by fire in 1881. Inaugurated in 1885, it is a typical example of Second Empire architecture.



#### Eze

This superb "eagle's nest" surveying the Peninsula of Saint-Jean-Cap-Ferrat, offers remarkably well-preserved medieval architecture. Its narrow streets with their vaulted houses and tiny shops owned by artists and craftsmen comprise the backcloth for the historic fête "Eze d'antan". The famous exotic gardens with their rare shrubs and plants are at the top of the village

## **Monte Carlo**

Monte Carlo is a heaven for lovers of luxury and sophistication. The cream of jewellers, designers and perfumers all have shops here. Some of the top designers even come to Monaco to find



inspiration. But now only the big names are present in Monaco.



There are also numerous shops and boutiques where visitors can find either traditional or more unusual gifts. Monte Carlo is also worldwide renowned through its casino in front of l'Hotel de ParisLodging at **Gray d'Albion Hotel** 

#### Day 5

## Golf at Cannes Mougins golf course

Opened in 1923, the Cannes Country Club was founded by prestigious members such as Prince Pierre de Monaco, Aga Kahn, or Baron Edouard de Rothschild. Its



original design was signed by Colt and Simpson, the most famous architects in the twenties, and then redesigned by Thomas and Alliss in 1978.

This sumptuous parkland course surrounded by oaks, pine-trees and fields of jasmine hosted 14 times the Cannes Mougins Open, part of the European PGA tour, with famous winners such as Greg Norman or Seve Ballesteros

Suggested sightseeing in the former middle age fortified village of Mougins. Perched 900 feet above sea level,

this wonderful Provencal village overlooking Cannes and the Riviera has attracted by its multiple charms many artists such as Francis Picabia, a surrealist painter or Picasso who lived here for many years. Renowned for its floral parks, Mougins is made of tiny streets winding around in a spiral and is the perfect place for art, craft and shopping

## Sightseeing in **Grasse**



Grasse is famous as the world

capital for perfumes. Its unique historic heritage has made it a rare example of well-preserved medieval architecture, while Fragonard, one of its native sons, brought its international culture renown. Many great perfumes, including Chanel's renowned N°5 have been elaborated here.

## Day 6

#### Golf at Taulane golf course

This challenging course designed by the champion Gary Player (his first course in France) sets in the heart of Provence mountains 3000 feet above sea level.

Surrounding the château de Taulane in a wild and natural landscape, the course offers spectacular views on the mountain

ranges. Both 9<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> holes end in front of the chateau with a huge double green (like at Saint-Andrews) sharply defended by a water hazard

## Suggested sightseeing and shopping in Cannes



Cannes and La Croisette, site of the worldwide known movie Festival, symbol of elegance, prestige and sophistication. Its lovely harbour hosts some of the most exclusive yachts in the world. If Cannes is a terrific place for shopping, this glamour seaside resort is also famous for its beaches and casinos.

#### **Suguet Quarter in Cannes**



This is the old Cannes, built on the rocky slopes looking down onto the sea and far enough away from the STRASS and glitter of La Croisette. Old houses, twisting alleyways, an old chateau of Cannes and a lively atmosphere: Provence rediscovered!

**The "lles de Lérins"** is a small archipelago just off the coast of Cannes and part of the commune of Cannes. The archipelago has the two main islands of Sainte-Marguerite and Saint-Honorat and the two micro-islands of Tradelière and St-Féréol.

Boat excursions to the islands leave from Cannes (15 minutes to Saint-Honorat and 30 minutes to Sainte-Marguerite). Excursions also leave from Antibes, Golfe-Juan, La Napoule and Nice. The islands are pedestrian-only; no motor vehicles are allowed.

## Day 7

## Golf at Royal Mougins golf course



The Royal Mougins Golf Club is a private international Golf Club ranked as one of Europe's best golf courses. Set in a wonderful Provencal landscape, Royal Mougins Golf Course is located within 20 minutes from La Croisette of Cannes.

Robert Van Hagge has created an exciting and spectacular golf course which has to be played with one's brain. Club selection is a key point to keep the ball in play and avoid the water hazards dotted around the eighteen holes. Its high slope (145) perfectly illustrates how challenging this course can be.

Suggested sightseeing in **Saint-Paul de Vence**, a tiny Provencal village famous for its painting galleries.

Located between mountains and sea, the medieval village of St Paul, from its 60 feet rocky outcrop, overlooks the surrounding landscape, with the Mediterranean sea and the Cap d'Antibes, the Alps and the Esterel Mountains.

St Paul's landscape, natural site, architecture and buildings are the third most visited historical site in France.

"The Sun in St Paul is, by far, the most beautiful of the entire Provence. It is also the country where the best variety of oranges grow..." (Vauban to Louis XIV. January 7<sup>th</sup> 1701).
